Dear Sirs,

With reference to the case of your proposed S.No.509 I have to inform you that with the dimensions and particulars furnished, the provisional summer freeboard allotted by the Tables as a cargo steamer only would be 12 feet 6 inches from statutory deck line one inch above 3" wood sheathing on steel awning deck, and the winter freeboard 8 inches more.

As, however, the plans show the vessel is intended for passenger service, the freeboard as a passenger steamer will be dependent on the watertight sub-division and will require to be dealt with in accordance with the regulations issued by the Board of Trade relating to the construction of passenger steamships.
