GREEK STEAMER SUNK BY U-BOAT

THREE MEN AND ENGLISH PILOT MISSING

Twenty-two members of the crew of the Greek steamer Konstantinos Hadjipateras (5,962 tons), which was sunk by a U-boat in the North Sea yesterday morning, were landed by lifeboat yesterday.

The captain, G. Halkias, stated that three members of the crew and the English pilot were missing.

Ambulances were waiting when the lifeboat arrived with 15 men after they had been transferred to her by a British vessel. Seven more men were landed last night.

Captain Halkias stated that his ship sank early yesterday. A few of the men got into a lifeboat and others dived overboard. Survivors were picked up in a few minutes by a British boat. The missing men were among those seen swimming in the water.

U-BOAT SINKS GREEK SHIP

BRITISH PILOT MISSING

Fifteen members of the crew of the Greek steamer Konstantinos Hadjipateras, 5,962 tons, which was sunk by a U-boat in the North Sea early yesterday, were landed by lifeboat later in the day at an East Coast port.

The captain, G. Halkias, stated that three members of the crew and the English pilot were missing, but eight other men had been picked up by another ship.
