"GIMLE"
A Reuter message from Oslo states that the Norwegian steamer Gimle, of Oslo, arrived at the port of Arendal on Saturday with 16 members of the crew of the Norwegian steamer Gimle, of Arendal, which sank after an explosion last Monday off the east coast of Britain. The crew of the Gimle spent over three days in the lifeboats before being rescued. Three men are missing. The Gimle's gross tonnage was 1271 tons gross. She was owned by the Skibs A/S Froland (Mr. E. Tørstensen, manager). She was built in 1916 by Jørgen & Hans, Hendrik Ido Ambacht.

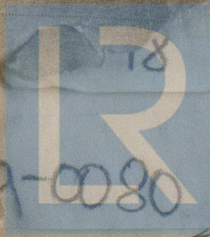
