Dear Sir,

With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the steamer "CAIRNGORM", which vessel is laid up at Bowling, I beg to acquaint you I am informed by the Society's Glasgow Office that she is now your property, and, in the circumstances, I think it well to inform you that the Third Special Survey No. 3 became due at the end of December, 1935, and that a proposal to carry out this inspection within the year of grace, i.e. before the end of December next, has been agreed to by the Committee. The Screwshaft Survey became due at the end of December last, and, in view of the fact that the vessel was laid up, action in regard to this inspection was deferred, but the inspection will require to be held before the vessel resumes trading.

I may add that the vessel's class is subject to some corroded bottom rivets in A & B strakes (port and starboard) forward being renewed before the end of next month, ^{to} the stern bush being rewooded, the shafting re-aligned and the funnel repaired before the vessel proceeds to sea.
