Dear Sir,

With reference to the case of the steam trawler "CYMREA" now under Survey with a view to her being classed with this Society, we duly received your letter of the 28th instant addressed to the Registrar General of Shipping.

Before handing this letter to Messrs. W.A. Massey & Sons, Ltd., we think it well to inform you that we shall have no opportunity of seeing the propeller shaft of the vessel.

She was placed upon the slipway to-day, but the Superintendent has decided not to draw the shaft as it appears to have been examined very recently by the British Corporation surveyors.

The Hull Trawlers Insurance officials have decided that from their point of view the shaft need not be drawn till the end of this year.

In these circumstances, our first entry report upon hull and machinery will be complete with the exception of the examination of the screw shaft, and we shall be glad to know if your enclosed letter should be handed to Messrs. W.A. Massey & Sons, or if an amended letter should be written.
