Steam Trawler "CYMREA", No. 81597 in the Register Book, 277 tons gross, built by the Ailsa Shipbuilding Co., in 1918, and classed with the British Corporation.

The Hull Surveyors report that this vessel has recently changed hands, her new name is to be "SIR MARK SYKES", and the new Owners, Messrs. Farrows Steam Fishing Co.Ltd., desire the vessel to be classed with this Society.

The vessel would appear to be one of the "Castle" type Trawlers, of which a number were built during the War, some to class with this Society and some with the British Corporation, and in a similar case a few weeks ago (the "EDWARD CATTELY" now named "SIR JOHN HOTHAM"), the Hull Surveyors were informed that, provided the scantlings of the vessel were found to be in accordance with those shewn on the plans approved for similar vessels classed with this Society, the requirements of a Special Survey No. 3 be carried out, together with any other requirements of the Rules for vessels not built under Survey, and the vessel be found or placed in a thoroughly good and efficient condition, she would be eligible to be classed local "Steam Trawler" with this Society.

The case of the "CYMREA" has not been previously submitted by the Hull Surveyors, but it would appear that they have taken the Survey of this vessel in hand and are acting in accordance with the instructions sent them in the case of the "EDWARD CATTELY", but it is submitted they might be asked to confirm this.
