Dear Mr. Heck.

With reference to the official cables passed this week regarding the new screw shaft of the Motor Vessel "FAYAL" I called the Owners attention to the fact that by fitting a bronze liner on a 5 1/2" shaft the cone would not suit that of the propeller.

A suggestion has been made that a bronze flanged taper-bush be made and ground in the cone of the propeller, and metal welded at flange and end of cone and say 1/2" screwed countersunk bolts fitted around the flange.

The key-way then would be cut in the bush and the cone turned to fit the shaft.

I am enclosing a hurried rough sketch made by me this afternoon before going out on a job and I would be very obliged if you would very kindly advise me whether this suggestion would be accepted.

I have not run up against a case like this before and do not care to accept before making certain.

Am keeping exceedingly busy here and have very little time to myself.


