The Antwerp Surveyors in May 1934 reported this ship to have sustained considerable damage to port and starboard bow plating, framing etc. through collision and recommended repairs be effected before the vessel was again placed in commission.

Action was accordingly deferred for repairs.

In reply to enquiry the Antwerp Surveyors now write to the effect that the vessel has been sold to Messrs. Etablissements Van Heyghen Freres for breaking up purposes and that this firm wish to withdraw the vessel from class as she will be towed to Bruges to be broken up.

It is submitted that in the circumstances a record of 'To be broken up' might now be made in the Register Book.

The Antwerp Surveyors should be requested to advise this Office when the work of demolition has commenced.
