Précis of particulars of Casualty This vessel is reported to have been struck by a mine amidships in the North Sea on the 30th November, 1939.

She caught fire and sank early the following day.

The Owners concur.

The Realf struck a mine in the North Sea on Thursday. She caught fire before foundering early on Friday. Fifty-four members of the crew took to four boats and were picked up by the Italian steamer Santagata. A lifeboat landed the men at an East Coast port. One man, the third mate, is missing. According to the ship's officers the explosion occurred amidships. The Realf was owned by Messrs. G. Rønneberg & J. F. Galtung, of Moss, and was built at Malmö.
