SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

"RAGNI"

The Norwegian steamer Ragni, of 1264 tons gross, struck a mine and sank in the North Sea on Friday while on a voyage to Norway with coal. Six of her crew of 19 are missing, the survivors being picked up by a British steamer and landed at a North-East Coast port after having taken to the boats. The Ragni, originally the Frithof Eide, was built by the Campbelltown Shipbuilding Company, Ltd., Campbelltown, in 1919. She was subsequently the Hillbrook and Ebchester, and was acquired by Mr. Alf Lindö, of Haugesund, this year.
