Further to our submission of the 9th instant, in which we proposed opening out hanging bunkers to boiler space between Second and Third Decks, we have a communication from the Board of Trade to the effect that if the wing spaces in question can be considered open to the boiler room the side plating below the crown of the "engine room" should be removed, except in such parts essential for structural support.

As it is important that we include these now redundant spaces in the propelling power deduction, we submit for your consideration sketch in triplicate showing large openings to meet the Board of Trade requirements.

We propose leaving plating over two frame spaces at each end and plating over one frame space in way of web frame supports from ship's side, and trust that these arrangements will have your early approval.
