This vessel was recently classed 100 A- as recommended by the Surveyors as the 1st. and 2nd. bower anchors on board were not in accordance with those approved for the figure 1.

A letter has now been received from the Hull Surveyors, stating that Messrs. Wilson & Burlertson have been in communication with them requesting that the vessel might be classed 100 A.1. subject to the equipment being placed in order, as they are having difficulty with the Owners, who refuse to accept the vessel without 100 A.1. certificate.

It is submitted the figure 1 might be assigned subject to 1st. and 2nd. bower anchors of proper weight and test being supplied at the first convenient opportunity, as has been done in similar cases.
