SHIP FEARED LOST

British "Abbotsford"

Fears are felt for the safety of the British steamer Abbotsford, of 1585 tons gross, which is a week overdue at Dundee. She left Ghent on Mar. 8, on a passage which normally occupies three days. The owners, George Gibson & Co., Ltd., of Leith, state that they are hoping against hope that the vessel may turn up unexpectedly. The Abbotsford was built at Goole in 1924. Two vessels of this company's fleet, the Melrose and Borthwick, were lost in the North Sea last week.

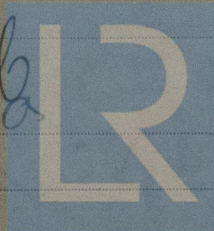
