Dear Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th instant enclosing your report of survey for Convention Freeboards in the case of the steamer "LINDENBANK", and with regard thereto I may say it is concluded that the machinery casings given on the above report are those on the superstructure deck, and I shall be glad if you will be good enough to state, for record purposes, the scantlings and particulars of doors, if any, of the machinery casings in the shelter tween decks; also the particulars of the doors giving access to the crew's entrance house on the poop deck.

I think it well to add that the freeboard request form has been received at this Office from the Owners, who state that this ship is leaving Avonmouth to-day for Antwerp to complete discharge, and I may say that they are being advised that the freeboards could be cut in on the steamer's sides at the latter port when the conditions on the sheet attached to the enclosed Assignment Letter have been complied with
