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AKESTER will say:-

I am a Surveyor to Lloyd's Register of Shipping and am employed in the Newcastle district.

I surveyed the M.V. "JOSEPH MEDILL" at Wallsend-on-Tyne on various dates between the 13th February, 1935, and the 10th August, 1935, during her construction for classification purposes.

The vessel was of all-welded construction and was fitted with twin screws.

I produce my Report of Survey No. 92860 dated the <sup>20th</sup> 21st August, 1935, which gives particulars of the dimensions, scantlings, anchors, cables, etc.

The vessel was built in accordance with plans approved by the Society; the material and workmanship were good. Necessary tests were made as required by Lloyd's Rules and the result of the tests was found to be satisfactory.




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I recommended that the vessel should be  
classed  A.1. for service on the Great Lakes  
and also in the Gulf of St. Lawrence between April  
and October.



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
