As no doubt you are aware, the Board of Trade have ordered a Formal Investigation into the loss of this vessel.

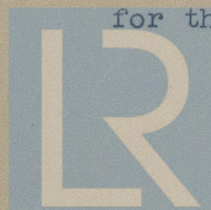
