Nicolaieff to Boston via Oran with iron ore.


*and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's*

damage repairs being effected at New York.

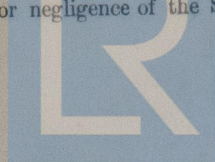
