the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Superintendent on behalf of the Owners survey the S/S "MELBA HENZELL" 6559 tons gross, of Hamburg, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature & extent of the damage stated to have been sustained while the vessel was being towed from Bermuda to Havana, during the month of March 1929.

For further particulars please see the log book.

On the 27th September 1930 & subsequent dates, the vessel then lying in the Canal Basin, Antwerp, the undersigned upon making examination found the fairlead on Starboard bow broken.

Recommended the fairlead to be renewed & the repairs carried out in such a manner as to place the vessel in the same good & efficient condition as she was in before the alleged damage was sustained.
