SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

STEAMER SUNK IN COLLISION

The Glasgow steamer Girasol (648 tons) sank off the South-East Coast of England yesterday after being in collision with the 6,000-ton Liverpool steamer Contractor. All the Girasol's crew of 11 were brought unhurt to a South-East Coast port last night by the Belgian tug Richard.

The Girasol received damage amidships which nearly cut her in two. One survivor said, "It was only the prompt action of the Contractor's captain in keeping his ship's bows fixed into our vessel which gave us time to get away in one of our boats without injury to any of us. Two minutes after we left our ship sank like a stone. The Richard picked us up and brought us to a South-East Coast port, where we finished the trip by rowing ashore in our boat."

COLLISION OFF S.-E. COAST

The British steamer Girasol, of 648 tons gross, sank off the south-east coast of England on Wednesday after having been in collision with the British steamer Contractor (6004 tons). There was no loss of life. The Girasol, which was built in 1926, was owned by Mr. Wm. Robertson, of Glasgow.

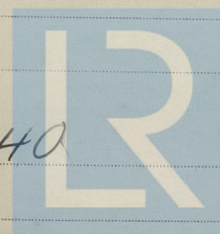
