Owners, attend on board the s.s. "BULGARIAN" (ex "OTTO LTHOFF") 2064 tons gross, No.68186 in the Register Book, first lying afloat in the West India Dock, London, on the 11th October, 1920, and subsequent dates, for the purpose of ascertaining the general condition of the hull.

Holds, tween decks, peaks, engine and boiler spaces examined as far as possible. Tank top under boilers examined.

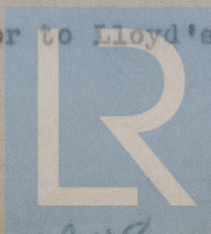
Bunkers examined as far as practicable. Limber boards fitted in holds and bilges examined.

Decks casings, hatchway coamings and supports, hatched, ventilators, windlass, steering gear and connexions, masts and rigging and general equipment examined. Double bottom tanks not opened up for survey.

Judging from the examination of the parts of the vessel which have now been examined, and after reading the reports of the Society's Surveyors on the surveys held at Burntisland 1st September, 1919, Hull 24th March, 1920, Newcastle 7th April, 1920, and Cardiff 13th October, 1920, I am of opinion the vessel appears to be in a fit condition to run for a further period of six months from November, 1920.
