Mr. James Wallace, representing the Managers, survey the steel screw steamer "OTTO KALTHOFF", No. 22699 in the Register Book, 2514 tons (gross) register on the 24th. March 1920, and subsequent dates while the vessel was lying in the Albert Dock, Hull for the purpose of ascertaining the general condition of the vessel.

The log books for the preceeding voyage were examined, when no record of any damage was found.

The following parts were examined:viz:-

Holds, peaks, decks, wteen decks, hatches, all bunkers, engine and boilerspace, masts and rigging, steering gear and windlass, anchors and general equipment, W.T. doors.

REPAIRS:-

Two fore and afters on No. 2 hatch repaired.

It was noticed that saddles and bunkers were badly covered with scale; the Owner's representative stated that this would be dealt with at an early date.

The vessel was not put in dry dock at this time owing to the inability to procure a dock, but it was stated that this also would be done at an early date.
