to her proceeding as a classed vessel to Italy for demolition,

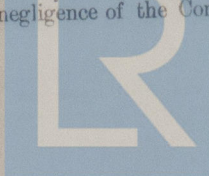
and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's
