I am in receipt of your letter of the 25th instant relating the general examination which you have been asked to carry out on the steamer "PURLEY OAKS" in view of the length of time the vessel has been laid up.

I note from your remarks that you are considering whether to continue running the vessel and carry out the survey, or to break her up for breaking up, and that you expect to be in a position to arrive at a decision during the next few weeks.
