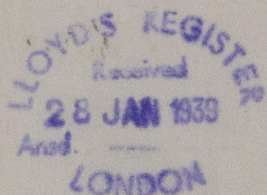

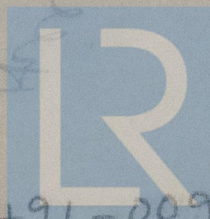
One damaged life-boat, some bales of cotton and a dead seaman have been located about 120 miles from Bombay and a search for any survivors is still being made.
