Dear Sir,

S. With reference to the classification in the Society's Register B502 of your steamer "ADMIRAL CRADOCK", I would remind you that in July last the Surveyor at Fleetwood inspected some temporary repairs which had previously been carried out at his port and in view of the report received from him the vessel's class was continued subject to the machinery casing top, W.T. tunnel in crossbunker, and crossbunker forward bulkhead being permanently repaired before the end of last month.

The Committee have had the case before them at their meeting to-day together with a communication which has been received from the Fleetwood Surveyor from which it appears that your representative has informed him that you desire the vessel to make another fishing trip before dealing with the repairs referred to above and I am directed to inform you that in the circumstances the Committee will not object to the repairs being further postponed as desired.

I would however add that they must rely on the repairs receiving attention on the vessel's return from her present

voyage as stated or they will have no option but to deal with her class.
