Dear Sirs,

With reference to your memoranda of the 10th and 14th instant respecting the cases of the steamers "SOJOURNER" and "TRADER", I have to inform you that if it is likely that these vessels are to continue to be laid up indefinitely, the Committee consider that the time has now arrived when a general examination should be carried out on each with a view to the class being allowed to remain undisturbed in the Register Book, whilst they are laid up.

As you are aware the Owners have furnished an undertaking in respect of the overdue Special Survey No.3 in the case of the "SOJOURNER" and of the Second Special Survey No.2 in the case of the "TRADER", and as the special survey in each case is now more than three years overdue, following the Committee's usual practice a report is now required to be furnished of their condition, with a view to the maintenance of their classes if they are to continue to be laid up.

I have therefore to request that you will take up the matter with the Owners and let me know what steps
