Dear Sirs,

With reference to your Mr. Brown's call at this Office on Friday last, in connexion with the cases of the steamers "TYNESIDER" and "TRADER", and to his request that a further extension until the end of the present month might be granted before laying the vessels up for the overdue Special Surveys, I beg to inform you that the cases have been under consideration today.

In view of the postponement which has already been granted in these cases, and of the fact that it was stated in my letter of the 5th September last that the decision conveyed therein was final, the Committee feel that they have been placed in an awkward position in regard to this further request. As, however, it was understood from Mr. Brown that an extension to the end of the present month would enable the vessels to complete their present commitments, the Committee have in the special circumstances reluctantly agreed to the postponement desired.

I am to add, however, that it must be distinctly understood that the Committee cannot entertain any further extension than that which has now been granted, and I shall
