

s.s. "TRADER" & "TINESIDER"

Mr. Brown of the firm of Messrs. Robinson, Brown & Co. of Newcastle, who own these vessels, called at this Office on Friday afternoon regarding the Special Surveys which are overdue on these vessels.

The Committee had both cases before them on the 5th September last, when they agreed to a special request which had been made by the Owners for postponement to allow the matter to be deferred in the case of the "TINESIDER" for two months and in the case of the "TRADER" for one month.

The year of grace allowed for the completion of the "TINESIDER" expired in August, and in the case of the "TRADER" in July.

In both cases therefore the extension which the Committee agreed to has just expired and Mr. Brown, after fully explaining the difficulty he has had to contend with, has again asked for permission to leave the matter over until the end of the present month.

He states that this request is made in order that the time charter on which the "TINESIDER" is running may be fulfilled, and in the case of the "TRADER", he states that the vessel is now at Kings Lynn to take a contract cargo to the Yorkshire Coast, whence she will, after discharge, proceed to the Tyne, and in this case also he asks the Committee's indulgence to allow a further postponement until the end of the month.
