Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 16th instant P. relative to the issue of an Irish freeboard certificate to the steamer "ELSIE ANNIE", I have to acquaint you that an Annual Freeboard Survey was carried out on this ship at Swansea on the 28th instant and in reply to enquiry as to whether the lettering of the markings had been altered to correspond with Irish Law in order that an Irish freeboard certificate may be issued, the Surveyor writes as follows:-

"I am in receipt of your letter of the 29th instant concerning the Annual Freeboard Survey of the steamer "ELSIE ANNIE", and in reply thereto, I have to state that when the survey was held, this vessel was loaded to her marks, and as I was unaware that there was any special lettering for vessels registered in the Irish Free State, no particular attention was paid to the lettering, and I am therefore unable to state whether the alteration referred to in your letter has been made."
