SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

The United States steamer, American Shipper, put back 150 miles to rescue the crew of the Glasgow freighter, Blairlogie, which was sunk off the Irish coast, and a wireless report received by the United States Line says that they are "all well," but it may be some time before they return home.

CONTINUING VOYAGE

It is understood that the American Shipper is outward bound and will continue her voyage with the rescued men on board. Nearly all are from Glasgow and the West of Scotland. The master is Capt. D. B. Macalpine, of Helensburgh.

The Blairlogie was built in 1929 at Stockton and is owned by the Clydesdale Navigation Co.

Blairlogie (4425 tons), of Glasgow, was sunk off Ireland. The crew were saved by the American Shipper, which turned back 150 miles to rescue them. The crew, nearly all from Glasgow, are not, however, expected home for at least three weeks.


