Dear Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 30th ultimo respecting the steamer "ABERCRAIG" in confirmation of your telephone message that the vessel has been sold and will proceed to Newport, Mon. this week to be broken up.

In connexion therewith I have to state that provided you satisfy yourself that the vessel is fit to make the voyage, special attention being paid to the windlass and steering gear and, if steam is to be raised in the boiler, you are satisfied that the weld on the crown of the starboard furnace is efficient for the voyage, you will be authorised to issue an Interim Certificate for the vessel to proceed to Newport, Mon., either under her own steam or in tow to be broken up.

You will be good enough to advise this Office immediately should the vessel leave Appledore without being submitted to your inspection.
