The 3rd.S.S.No.2 became due in 7.35, and,after an examination in dry dock in January 1936,a proposal to carry out the survey within the year of grace was agreed to.

The vessel is laid up at Appledore, and the usual Undertaking has been furnished.

The Plymouth Surveyor now states that the vessel is proceeding sometime this week to Newport, Mon. to be broken up. He does not know whether she is to be taken in tow or not.

It is submitted that provided the Surveyor satisfies himself that the vessel is fit to make the trip, special attention being paid to the windlass and steering gear, and if steam is ^{TO BE} raised in the boiler and the Surveyor is satisfied that the weld on the crown of the starboard furnace is efficient for the voyage, the vessel might be allowed to proceed to Newport Mon.,either under her own steam or in tow,to be broken up.
