I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 24th instant, in reply to mine of the 19th, relative to the overdue Third Special Survey of your steamer "AMERCRAIG".

The Committee note that you expect to complete the survey of this vessel at any moment and that the Committee will put her through survey immediately. If it may be the case, the Committee consider that arrangements should have been made to have dealt with the vessel by the time the year of grace allowed for its survey expired, viz: by the end of last month, and are surprised that you have continued to operate the vessel without their sanction beyond that date.

In these circumstances, I am directed to say that the Committee are sorry to learn from the Shipping Papers that the vessel is at Bristol, where every facility for carrying out the survey is available, unless arrangements are made at once to bring the vessel to the survey at that port, the Committee will have no alternative but to give instructions for the vessel to be expunged with a red line, indicating
