Dear Sir,

S. I have to inform you that the steamer "HAVILDAR" (No.26235 in the Register Book) has been sold to Japanese shipbreakers and is at present loading at Calcutta for Japan where, on arrival, she is to be broken up.

The Second Special Survey No.3 became due on this vessel in July, 1935, and in November last the Society's Surveyor at Bombay stated that the Owners only wished to deal temporarily with a small local fracture on the port side in the 2nd plate in the 3rd strake below the main sheer and in way of one panting stringer lug, in view of the fact that the vessel was to be broken up early this year. The vessel's class was continued accordingly.

I have therefore to request that you will be good enough to keep the case in mind and let me know, as soon as possible after the vessel's arrival in Japan, when it is expected demolition will be commenced.
