Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter dated 20th. September 1927, assigning a freeboard to the Steam Tug "CHIRM CHOM PHOL", W. S. Bailey & Co's Hull No. 243, I have to advise that scuttle ports have been cut in the vessel's sides which materially affect the position of the load line as assigned.

The freeboard shown on the attached verification Form has been marked on the vessel's sides in accordance with para. 23 of the freeboard regulations, giving Indian Summer line 6" below the sill of the lowest side scuttle.

Mean draught 8 feet.

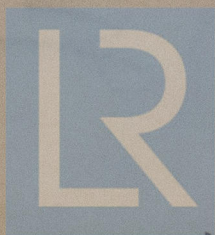
