This trawler was reported to have gone ashore on Sable Island, 200 miles west of Halifax, N.S., on the 12th September.

The Halifax Surveyor intimated, in a letter dated 17th September, that she would become a total loss.

A casualty notice was sent to the Owners on the 4th October, but no reply has been received.

Upon inquiry at Lloyd's by telephone today it was stated that the Underwriters had accepted the vessel as a total loss.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

LEMBERG.—Camperdown Wireless Station, Sept. 12.—4.42 a.m., G.M.T., trawler Lemberg ashore north-east bar, Sable Island, east light bearing SW. by W. seven miles distant. No immediate danger. Steamer Sundance proceeding assistance, arriving about 9 a.m.

Halifax, Sept. 12.—At 4.45 a.m., G.M.T., on Sept. 12, trawler Lemberg grounded on the bar and remains striking heavily, north east bar Sable Island, east light bearing SW. by W. seven miles distant. In no immediate danger. Steamer Sundance will proceed immediately to assist, expected to arrive at 9 a.m.

New York, Sept. 12.—British steam trawler Lemberg sent out an S O S message at 12.40 a.m., E.S.T., according to the Mackay Radio Corporation. It was reported that the vessel was ashore on the east bar of Sable Island. Later, American steamer Schodack reported that she was 40 miles away and was going to the assistance of the Lemberg.

American steamer Schodack has wirelessed the Lemberg saying that she will not be able to reach her for six hours owing to heavy weather.—British United Press.

LEMBERG.—Halifax, Sept. 12.—The 15 men of the crew of the British trawler Lemberg have been rescued by lifeboats. The trawler is stated to be a total loss.—British United Press.

LEMBERG.—Halifax, Sept. 16.—After being marooned on Sable Island, 200 miles west of Halifax, since last Sunday (Sept. 12), the master and crew of 24 of the wrecked trawler Lemberg were taken off by a lifeboat to-day and transferred to the steamer O-we-ra. They are now on their way to Halifax.—Exchange Telegraph Company.
