Dear Mr. Scott:

With reference to Mr. Sladden's letter of the 4th January last and subsequent correspondence in connection with the S. S. "QUARRINGTON COURT" Court proceedings in this City, I wish to state that, as the testimony is now completed, we have received a letter from Haight, Griffin, Deming and Gardner, solicitors for the Owners, requesting a bill to cover any fee or expenses in this case.


I have discussed this matter with Mr. Heck and he states that he does not propose, in this case, to submit a personal bill for the time occupied in giving his expert testimony, but suggests that, as he had a total attendance in Court of about six and one-half days, also two consultations with Mr. Potter of the Isthmian Line and two with Mr. Griffin, a bill should be rendered on behalf of the Society for \$500.00. Before rendering this bill, however, I think it well to seek your advice, in case there may be other expenses incurred in London which should be added to this amount.
