Although the Fleetwood trawler Davara was shelled on Friday for half an hour, her skipper and crew were able to get safely away in their boat.  
 The skipper, Captain Boyles, said:—  
 "We counted 35 rounds. We managed to lower the lifeboat, although it had been damaged, and I got my crew of 11 aboard and we put away. We baled for five hours before we were picked up, and I was then so exhausted with rowing and baling that I had to be hauled on board with ropes."

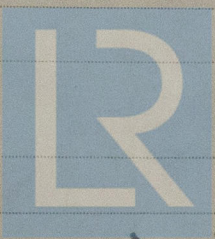
