## SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

Valencia, May 25.—British steamer THORPEHALL sunk one mile off Valencia port while at anchor. Crew landed here; one man injured.—Lloyd's Agent.

Madrid, May 25.—British steamer THORPEHALL was sunk by two bombs dropped from a seaplane about a mile from Valencia this morning.—British United Press.

Madrid, May 25.—Both bombs are reported to have made direct hits on the steamer THORPEHALL. One officer and one member of the crew were wounded.—British United Press.

Valencia, May 25.—The British cargo steamer THORPEHALL, which was anchored a mile and a half off the entrance to Valencia harbour, has been sunk by two of four bombs dropped by seaplanes coming from Majorca. One officer and one man were wounded. The remainder were saved. The THORPEHALL left Marseilles for Valencia on Saturday (May 21), and was carrying a general cargo.—Reuter.

Barcelona, May 25.—Five of the crew were seriously wounded when the steamer THORPEHALL was bombed and sunk by an insurgent warplane from Majorca outside Valencia Harbour at 4.50 this morning. They are being treated in the provincial hospital. Several other members of the crew were slightly injured. They have been transferred to another vessel. Two out of four bombs dropped by the plane hit the THORPEHALL, which is reported to have been loaded with 3000 tons of wheat.—Reuter.

London, May 26.—Waiting off Valencia harbour ready to discharge her cargo of wheat, the British steamer THORPEHALL was early yesterday morning bombed and sunk by an insurgent plane. Five of the crew were wounded. They are John Kingston, Frederick Kesson, the cook, a lascar, Rakin Ulla, from Cardiff, a Portuguese and a Spaniard. Two bombs crashed through No. 3 hold. The THORPEHALL immediately developed a heavy list and the master gave orders to abandon ship. Boats were lowered and the crew took off.—"News Chronicle."

Barcelona, May 26.—A statement issued by the National Defence Ministry states that during yesterday's insurgent air raid on Valencia, when the British steamer THORPEHALL was sunk, the first officer and an Irish Non-Intervention observer were seriously wounded.—Exchange Telegraph Company.
