

The Board have under investigation the circumstances attending the loss of the s.s. "Pegaway" of Newcastle, Official Number 148067, on the 4th April last, whilst on a voyage from the Tyne for Hamburg with a cargo of coal.

It is understood that the vessel was classed with Lloyd's Register at the time of her loss, and I am to request that the Committee of Lloyd's Register will be good enough to arrange for the Board to be furnished with the following documents at an early date, in order that they may be in full possession of all available information bearing on the casualty.

1. Copies of survey reports for all surveys from and including the last special survey in 1937.
2. Copy of freeboard certificate.
3. Copy of freeboard computation.
