Dear Sir,

M. I duly received your letter of the 23rd ultimo respecting the proposed classification with this Society of the T.S.S. "GARDENGA", together with a plan in duplicate showing proposed modifications to the strengthening previously approved, and have to acquaint you that the contents have been carefully noted.

With regard thereto I am directed to state that the scantlings and arrangements as shown and amended on the plan will be approved, provided they be carried out to the satisfaction of the Surveyors.

At the same time I have to state that the equipment as shown and amended on the plan will be approved for the figure "1".

It is observed that the material proposed to be used in carrying out the alterations and repairs has been made at a recognised works, but without test certificates from a classification Society, and in the circumstances it is proposed to make tensile and bend tests on an approved testing machine on samples cut from the plates and angles. This proposal

will be approved.

In reply to your enquiry I have to acquaint you that a fee of £37 for hull and machinery, exclusive of any travelling or incidental expenses, should be charged.
