He proposes to take advantage of the vessel being laid up, to carry out the survey for the assignment of freeboards under the International Convention Rules. We shall be glad to know what particulars will be required, and to receive any information which may be in your possession to guide us in carrying out the survey.

If a scale of Fees for the assignment of Convention freeboards has been decided on, we shall be glad to receive a copy of it, if not, we shall be glad to know what fees should be charged for the assignment of freeboards to the steamer "BELGENLAND".
