the Master and the Agents of the British S.S. "ARGYLLSHIRE" this day make an examination of certain ports in the Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 tween decks, and which were cut when the vessel was taken over as a troop ship in Sydney.

The ports have been carefully cut, double dead lights fitted and in every way made satisfactory, and up to Classification requirements.

Before re-building the insulation at the square of the ports where cut away, the ports were tested for leakage and all found tight.

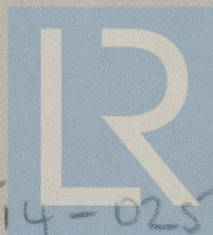
The insulation has been made good and the brine piping is being renewed and will be reported upon after being tested at Buenos Aires, before the vessel takes in cargo, presumably frozen meat.
