That the centre of such disc is placed at 11 feet and $0\frac{1}{2}$ inch below the upper deckline (Steel Shelterdeck) marked under the provisions of International Loadline Convention of 1930.

That the maximum Loadline in Tropical Fresh Water to be 15 inches above the centre of the disc.

That the maximum Loadline in Fresh Water to be $7\frac{3}{4}$ inches above the centre of the disc.

That the Tropical Loadline to be $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches above the centre of the disc.

That the maximum Loadline in Winter to be $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches below the centre of the disc.

This certificate is to remain in force until a new Loadline certificate is issued.
