The 3rd Special Survey N°1 became due in July, 1934.

The vessel has been laid up, and the Owners furnished the usual undertaking.

The Newcastle Surveyors reported on the 15th November, 1935. They had carried out a general examination afloat in order to permit the vessel to make an intended voyage to Spain with a cargo of coal, and afterwards to be broken up.

The Newcastle Surveyors stated, in a communication dated 16th March, 1936 that she had sailed for Rosyth on the previous day & on arrival she would be broken up by the Metal Industries Ltd.

The Leith Surveyors now state, in a letter dated 24th March, that the work of demolition has been commenced.
