S. I have to inform you that the steamer "TREESPOOL" which has been laid up in the River Tyne for some time past under the usual undertaking in respect of the overdue 3rd Special Survey No.1, was generally examined by the Newcastle Surveyors in November last with a view to a certificate being granted to enable her to proceed to Spain with a cargo of coal to be broken up. This appears to have fallen through, as I am today in receipt of a letter again from the Newcastle Surveyors stating that the vessel left the Tyne on the 15th instant for Rosyth where she is to be broken up by Messrs. Metal Industries Ltd.

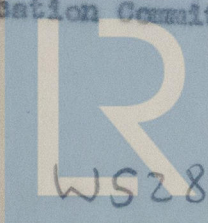
I shall therefore be glad if you will be good enough to let me know in due course when demolition has been commenced.
