Dear Sirs,

With reference to the Third Special Survey No.1 which became due on the steamer "TEESPOOL" at the end of July, 1934, I have to acquaint you this vessel has been laid up at Newcastle-on-Tyne for some time past and the usual undertaking has been furnished.

In October last the Owners stated that the vessel would probably be sold to Spain or Japan to be broken up, and they were informed that the Committee would be agreeable to the vessel's class being maintained for delivery in either Country provided a general examination were carried out.

The vessel is now reported to have been sold to Spain to be broken up and the Committee have had before them a report from the Newcastle Surveyors of a general examination of the vessel afloat, including the steering gear and windlass, and they have agreed to the vessel proceeding to Spain with a cargo of coal, and afterwards to be broken up.

In the circumstances, I shall be glad if you will keep this case in mind, and advise me promptly as soon as the work of demolition is commenced.
