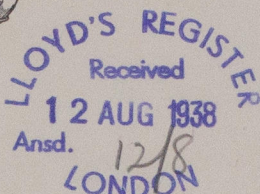

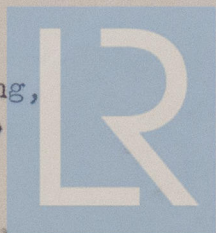


Sir,

I am directed to inform you that Mr. G.A. Green, a Senior Ship Surveyor of the Board in Glasgow, has been appointed, as an Inspector under Section 465 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to make a Preliminary Inquiry into the circumstances attending the loss of the s.s. "RUMORE".

For the purposes of the Preliminary Inquiry it is necessary for Mr. Green to investigate, inter alia, the history and condition of the vessel prior to her disappearance and the Board would be glad if your Committee would give him access to such records and reports concerning the vessel which may be in your possession as he may require. It would be most convenient if Mr. Green could be afforded facilities in Glasgow for the inspection of the requisite records and reports but arrangements will be made
