Dear Sirs,

With reference to the Second Special Survey No. 3 and Boiler Survey which became due at the end of February and May last respectively on the steamer "SPILSBY", I have to acquaint you that in view of the fact that this vessel was laid up in the Tyne the Committee deferred action on the case.

In June last a letter was received from the Owners intimating that they were contemplating the sale of this vessel to Italians for the purpose of being broken up and that she might possibly be sent to Italy with a cargo. In reply the Owners were informed that with regard to the fact that the Second Special Survey No. 3 only became due in February last there would be no objection to the vessel's class being maintained for the voyage, they were also informed that as the Boiler Survey became due in May the Committee would not require this survey to be carried out if the vessel was to proceed to Italy within a reasonably short time of that date.

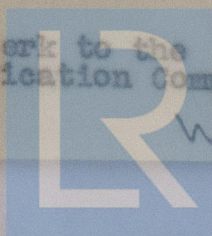
In the circumstances I shall be glad to learn whether this vessel is still laid up.
