Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 29th ultimo, from which I note that you are contemplating the sale of your s.s. "SPILSBY" to Italians for the purpose of being broken up, and that you may possibly send her out to Italy with cargo.

In reply to your enquiry as to whether there will be any objection to the vessel proceeding without a general examination, I have the pleasure to inform you that having regard to the fact that the Second Special Survey No.3 became due only in February last, there is no objection to your proposal, and the vessel's class will be maintained for such a voyage.

You are doubtless aware that the Boiler Survey, which became due in January last, has been carried out at New Orleans, Baltimore and Havana recently, and to entitle the vessel to a record of BS (Boilers surveyed) 3,35, there would only appear to be the safety valves of the starboard boiler remaining to be adjusted under steam.
